UCN is situated in Northern Denmark and has campuses in the cities of Aalborg, Hjørring and Thisted.

We are a university of applied sciences and provide higher education and perform research, development and innovation activities within the four main areas of business; education and social education; health; and technology.

UCN has a total of 10,000 students in academy profession and bachelor's degree programmes, more than 8,000 course participants in continuing education, and around 900 employees.

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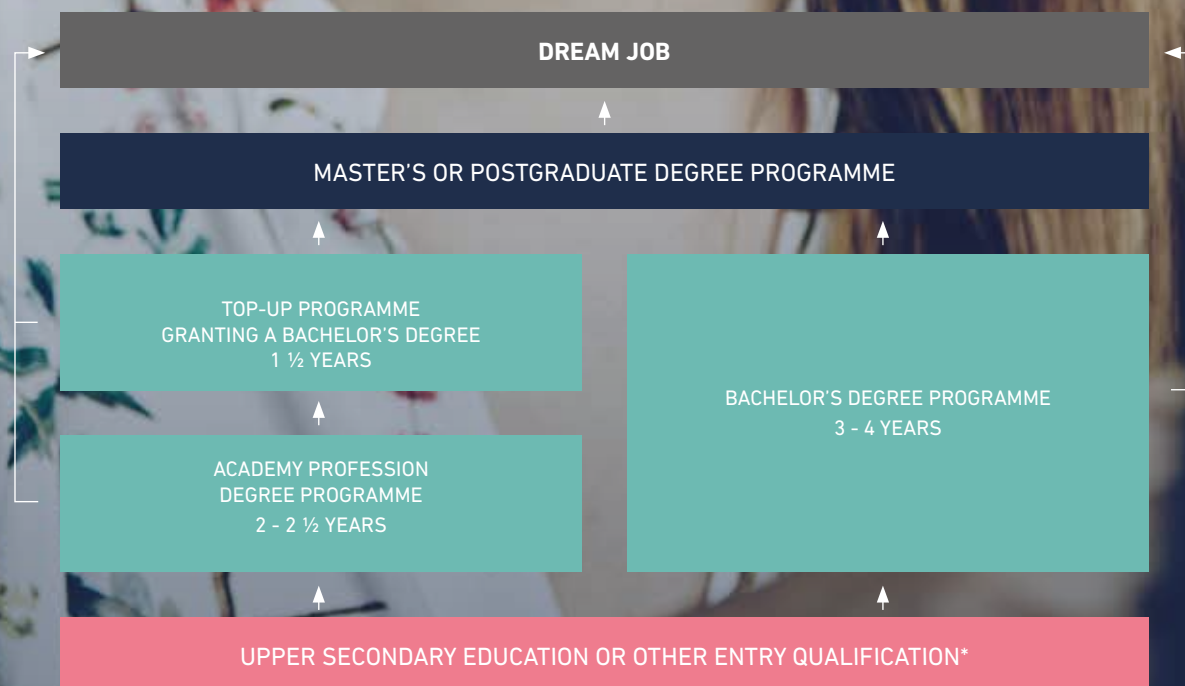

UNDERSTAND YOUR CHOICES

UCN offers three types of degree programmes.

A 3 ½-year bachelor's degree programme, a 2-year academy profession degree programme and a top-up degree programme, making the academy profession degree into a bachelor's degree with 1 ½ years of additional study.

These pages provide a guide to help explain the different types of degrees and how to combine them to suit your needs and ambitions.



* Please note that upper secondary education may be termed differently in your country. Upper secondary education is usually the last step before higher education. Please also note that specific requirements vary from programme to programme. Find more information about admission requirements on page 56.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE

A bachelor's degree at a university college is typically 3 ½ years of study, combining both theory and practice within its field.

The degree includes a compulsory internship in a business or organisation in Denmark or abroad for the duration of six months.

The degree can be studied within a single field of study or as a combination of an academy profession degree (2 years) and a top-up degree (1 ½ years) as described below.

UCN's bachelor's degree programmes:

- > Architectural Technology and Construction Management
- > Export and Technology Management

ACADEMY PROFESSION DEGREE

An academy profession degree is a short, 2-year programme that is typically aimed at a business or industry career.

The academy profession degree programme combines theory with practice and contains a compulsory internship of approximately three months.

As an AP graduate, you may combine your degree with a suitable 1 ½-year top-up degree, earning you a bachelor's degree.

TOP-UP DEGREE

A top-up degree is 1 ½ years of study to supplement an academy profession degree making it equal to a full bachelor's degree in quality and length.

The top-up degree programme combines theory with practice and contains a compulsory internship of approximately three months.

As an example, you may start out with an academy profession degree in Marketing Management and after graduation apply to a top-up programme to achieve a bachelor's degree in e.g. Sport Management.

REAL LIFE EDUCATION

At UCN, you will never work with theories just for the sake of following a curriculum. All our programmes are continuously developed in close collaboration with the industry they are preparing you for, and they all include internships.

A DIFFERENT WAY OF LEARNING

Depending on where you are from, you may find that the learning approach at UCN is somewhat different from what you are used to. It can take a little time to get the hang of it, but the feedback from our international students shows us that the learning approach is one of the things they often grow to love the most.

In general, education in Denmark is known for its innovative approach to learning, focusing greatly on building analytical skills and the ability to form opinions and find solutions and new ideas. The ability to work independently as well as in teams is also a top priority.

At UCN, we see it as our most important task to educate you so that you are prepared for the labour market of the future.

You will never be presented with theoretical knowledge without also working with and understanding its practical day-to-day implications. You will be presented with real life situations and issues, and you will often collaborate with businesses and organisations on various projects. In teaching situations, we also keep a close eye on the most recent knowledge and research within a programme field.

This way, we will help you develop a strong ability to reflect on your own field and performance. We call our unique approach to learning: Reflective Practice-Based Learning. You can read more about it at www.ucn.dk/english

There are countless ways to learn new things. In fact, this is one of the first things you will learn at UCN.

Part of your studies will be scheduled lectures and classroom teaching. However, an equally large part of your studies will be case work, simulations, internships, lectures by guest professors, self-study, tours of various businesses, interdisciplinary studies as well as collaborative projects with your fellow students.

INTERNSHIPS: LEARN HANDS ON

In the course of your studies, you will do a compulsory internship in a business or organisation in Denmark or abroad.

During the internship, you will experience being part of a professional workforce within your field. You will get the opportunity to grow professionally, learn new things hands on and put all your acquired knowledge, skills and competences into practice.

The internship gives you invaluable insight into the workings of your industry and brings you a big step closer to your future work life.

BE AN ACTIVE STUDENT

As a student at UCN, you will build a close bond with both teachers and fellow students. It is expected that you attend and participate actively in class as a full-time student. We believe this is the best way for you to learn as much as possible.

You will often be part of a small class of students, and you will only rarely find yourself in a lecture hall or a large auditorium with hundreds of students.

Active participation is key when it comes to learning at UCN. This also means that it is your responsibility to make the most of your studies.



TAKE THE NEXT STEP

Are you bubbling with business ideas? And do you have the drive to make those ideas come to life? Then we will help you take the next step!

'Next Step' is in fact the name of our thriving entrepreneurial community. We have a great passion for entrepreneurship and work hard in creating the right framework and support for our students to test their ideas and make their start-up dreams a reality.

LIFE ON CAMPUS

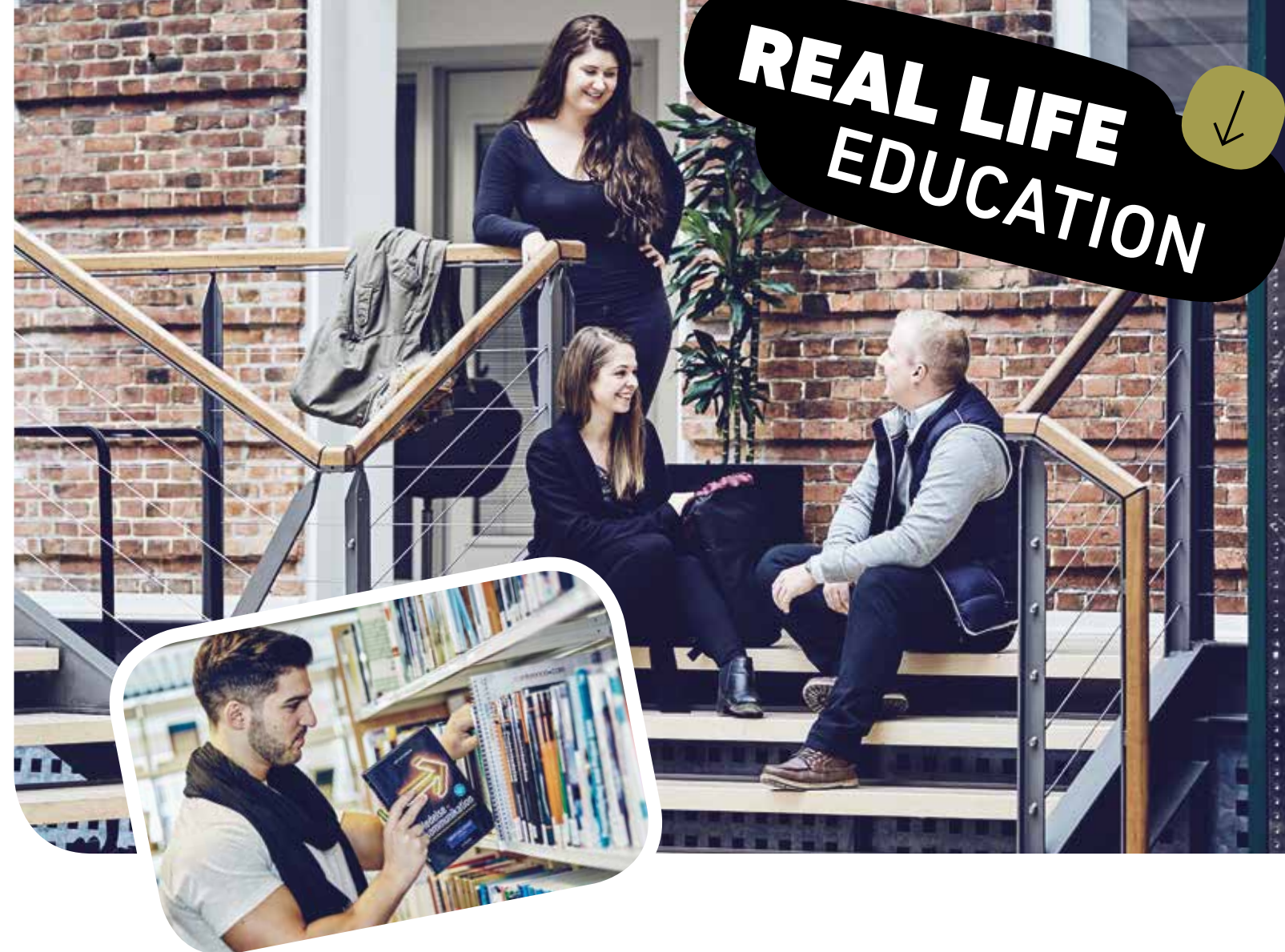

AALBORG CITY LIFE

With more than 120,000 inhabitants, Aalborg is Denmark's fourth largest city and the largest city in Northern Denmark. Approximately 25,000 students make Aalborg an exciting, vibrant and fun student city with lots to offer.

Aalborg is located on the banks of the picturesque Limfjord, separating the northernmost part of Denmark from the rest of the Jutland peninsula. The city's waterfront was once Aalborg's industrial heart, but its shipyards and heavy industries have now been replaced with a blooming cultural district and city centre where you can experience world-class architecture, exciting cuisine, busy shopping streets and enjoy a cosy, yet cosmopolitan atmosphere.

As a true cosmopolitan city, Aalborg has its own airport and offers a wide array of events within sports, theatre, concerts and festivals. EXPORT AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT

DEGREE TYPE: BACHELOR **DURATION:** 3½ YEARS **INTERNSHIP:** 1 SEMESTER
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER **LOCATION:** AALBORG

Do you want the world as your workplace? Do you want to work with export on the global market?

More and more companies operate internationally, and there is an increasing demand for competent employees with an insight into the global export market. With the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Export and Technology Management, you will be well-prepared for the future.

The programme has a strong international focus and includes technical as well as mercantile subjects. Our primary focus is where businesses and customers meet.

You will become a specialist in the sale and service of technical products and solutions. You will learn to prepare sales and marketing plans targeted at different customer groups in the global market. Furthermore, you will gain an insight into different types of businesses, production planning, cultural differences and entrepreneurship.

As a Bachelor of Export and Technology Management, you may find employment in Danish and international companies.

Examples of job titles could be export consultant, logistics consultant, product consultant or procurement officer. In the long term, you can also work towards becoming an export manager, product manager or procurement manager.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programme is divided into three core areas: Technical resources, strategic business planning and interrelations.

Technical resources:

Product development, production process, construction, design, materials, project management, innovation, IT systems, quality management.

Strategic business planning:

Law, logistics, marketing, micro and macro economics.

Inter-relational subjects:

Negotiation techniques, communication and culture, organisation, scientific methodology.

SEMESTERS

The three core areas above are taught with a distinctive focus in each semester:

- Semester 1: The company and its internal systems
- Semester 2: Market understanding
- Semester 3: Market strategy
- Semester 4: The selling organisation
- Semester 5: Internship in Denmark or abroad
- Semester 6: Smart factory, e-commerce and elective module
- Semester 7: Global supply chains and final-year project

INTERNATIONAL SALES AND MARKETING

DEGREE TYPE: TOP-UP DURATION: 1½ YEARS INTERNSHIP: 3-4 MONTHS
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER LOCATION: AALBORG

Are you passionate about top-level international sales and marketing?
Do you see yourself working in a global company?

This is a top-up programme intended for graduates of the Academy Profession Degree Programme in Marketing Management (page 18). The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in International Sales and Marketing with only 1 ½ years of additional study.

In this programme, you will gain insight and understanding of the various factors that significantly influence the sales of goods and services in Denmark and on an international scale.

You will learn about what underlies a company's sales and business development from an international perspective. You will also acquire knowledge of marketing, logistics, law, management and economics.

Furthermore, the programme includes elective components, which means that you will have an influence on the shaping of your professional profile.

As a Bachelor of International Sales and Marketing, you may find employment in Denmark as well as abroad.

Examples of job titles could be project manager, sales coordinator, key account manager or marketing coordinator. In the long term, you can also work towards becoming a marketing manager, sales manager or export manager.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Semesters 1 and 2:

Lectures, project work, teaching and learning activities, case studies, mandatory assignments all within a thematic structure.

Core subjects:

- Marketing
- Supply chain management
- Management and organisation
- Business law
- Economics
- Theory of science and scientific methods

These subjects are taught in the context of four overall themes:

- The strategic base of the company
- The customer as a starting point
- Industry and competitors
- Developing and managing the sales base

Semester 3:

- Internship in Denmark or abroad
- Final-year project

MARKETING MANAGEMENT

DEGREE TYPE: ACADEMY PROFESSION **DURATION:** 2 YEARS **INTERNSHIP:** 3 MONTHS
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER **LOCATION:** AALBORG

Do you want to work in marketing and sales? Do you want to improve, strengthen and develop company marketing strategies?

As an AP Graduate in Marketing Management, you will become a specialist in working systematically with company marketing. You will be skilled at analysing, planning and organising marketing activities.

During your studies, you will acquire knowledge about different cultures, communication forms and socio-economic conditions, and you will learn to analyse various types of businesses and markets, which in turn will enable you to prepare marketing solutions for companies in Denmark as well as abroad.

AP Graduates in Marketing Management find employment in Danish and international companies and organisations. They work as e.g. marketing consultants, advertising assistants, project managers, key account assistants, HR assistants and procurement assistants.

As an AP Graduate in Marketing Management, you can also choose to apply for admission to one of our top-up programmes, earning you a bachelor's degree after an additional 1 ½ years of study. Please note that admission in some cases is limited.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The first three semesters take place at UCN and consist of both compulsory and elective subjects. It is also possible to study a semester abroad.

Semester 4 consists of an internship at a company of your choice in Denmark or abroad. It also contains a final-year project which must be made in close collaboration with the internship host or another company of your choosing.

Semester 1:

- Business understanding
- Scientific methodology
- Market understanding

Semester 2:

- Tactical and operational marketing B2C
- Tactical and operational marketing B2B
- Internationalisation

Semester 3:

Choose between a number of elective subjects. Subjects are continually updated as the demands from the business world changes.

Examples of electives could be: entrepreneurship, modern marketing, digital marketing, project management, global markets, graphic design, procurement, sales, personal business communication, managerial economics, or statistics.

SERVICE, HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM MANAGEMENT

DEGREE TYPE: ACADEMY PROFESSION **DURATION:** 2 YEARS **INTERNSHIP:** 13 WEEKS
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER **LOCATION:** AALBORG

Do you want to create memorable experiences for others by developing, planning and delivering services?

The Academy Profession Degree Programme in Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management gives you the competences to work in development, management and marketing of services within one of three specialisation paths: tourism; hotel and restaurant; or sport and event management.

It will help you develop your communicative, intercultural and personal competencies to gain knowledge and understanding of the cultural and social conditions that affect the industry.

The programme is practice-oriented, and the knowledge you acquire in the course of the study programme is closely connected to real-life situations. This connection is supported by the internship taking place in a relevant business in Denmark or abroad on completion of the first academic year.

The Academy Profession Degree Programme in Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management opens the door to a broad range of job opportunities in the service industry, such as at hotels, restaurants, travel agencies and amusement parks, event management agencies as well as holiday and conference centres, sport clubs and associations.

As an AP Graduate in Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management, you can also choose to apply for admission to one of our top-up programmes, earning you a bachelor's degree after an additional 1 ½ years of study. Please note that admission in some cases is limited.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programme consists of:

- Four thematic elements (70 ECTS)
- Elective elements: specialisation and elective courses (20 ECTS)
- Internship (15 ECTS)
- Final-year project (15 ECTS)

As part of the specialisation, the student is required to carry out a 3-month internship after the first academic year. The internship will take place in a relevant business or organisation in Denmark or abroad.

At the end of the second academic year, the student must produce a final-year project. The project provides the opportunity to work on and resolve concrete and real-life issues originating from the internship company.

INTERNATIONAL HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

DEGREE TYPE: TOP-UP DURATION: 1½ YEARS INTERNSHIP: 13 WEEKS
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER LOCATION: AALBORG

Are you dreaming of an international career in the hospitality industry?

This is a top-up programme intended for graduates of Academy Profession Degree Programme in Marketing Management (page 18), or the Academy Profession Degree Programme in Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management (page 22). The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in International Hospitality Management with only 1½ years of additional study.

The programme will provide you with the competences to work in day-to-day operations, development, administration and management in an international work environment in the hospitality industry. A specialisation period will allow you to focus more deeply on either tourism, the hotel and restaurant industry or experience economy.

You will learn about management, strategy, economics, cultural awareness and customer relations. You will be provided with the tools to develop new markets and concepts, achieve an understanding of a company's strategic challenges as well as the ability to handle the practical implementation and operation of a company strategy.

For Danish students, the first semester will be taught in Danish, before the programme continues taught fully in English from the second semester. For international students, all semesters are fully taught in English.

This means that Danish and international students study together from the second semester, giving you valuable intercultural competences as well as an international network.

As a Bachelor of International Hospitality Management, you may find employment as resort manager, marketing coordinator, destination manager, or sales manager etc.

Are you dreaming of a career in the sport, event and leisure industry?

This is a top-up programme intended for graduates of the Academy Profession Degree Programme in Marketing Management (page 18), or Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management (page 22). The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in Sport Management with only 1½ years of additional study.

The programme is also intended for people with relevant experience and a background in the industry.

As a Bachelor of Sport Management, you will have a thorough understanding of the commercial mechanisms in the sport, event and leisure industry.

The programme covers the following subjects: academic methods and research in sport, sport marketing, sport management, sport law and sport economics.

On graduation, you will be able to find employment in various businesses and organisations in the sport, event and leisure industry. You might work as a project manager, event coordinator, administrator, marketing coordinator, consultant, etc.

ARCHITECTURAL TECHNOLOGY AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

DEGREE TYPE: BACHELOR DURATION: 3½ YEARS INTERNSHIP: 20 WEEKS
START OF TERM: SEPTEMBER LOCATION: AALBORG

Do you see yourself developing, leading and managing large construction works? Are you dreaming of a career in the Danish or international construction industry?

As a Bachelor of Architectural Technology and Construction Management, you will be an expert in planning, designing and coordinating construction and building projects.

You will usually play a central role as project manager or site manager in a construction, engineering or architectural company. You will take part in the planning of construction projects from draft drawings to completed project designs, and you will typically contribute e.g. technical calculations to construction and project plans in the building process.

During the course of the study programme, you will learn about construction, material selection, digital modelling and condition surveying as well as operating a business, project design and production, and much more.

You will have the opportunity to specialise in e.g. energy and sustainability, management or digital construction.

Please note that on completion of the first 1 ½ years (Three semesters) of study, you can opt for either:

- An Academy Profession Degree Programme in Construction Technology (2 years); or
- A Bachelor's Degree Programme in Architectural Technology and Construction Management (3 ½ years).

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Semesters 1 and 2:

Focus on study areas connected with the overall planning and building of family homes as well as an emphasis on construction details, building materials and process planning.

Semester 3:

- Focus on individual building components such as wood and concrete components for pre-fabricated building.
- Construction and implementation of industrial buildings, sports buildings, etc.

You will be in charge of practical work, including installing, programming, commissioning, optimising and operating automatic systems in technical production and manufacturing environments.

The programme will give you broad knowledge of the implementation and optimisation of various technical control systems and automated industrial facilities.

As an AP Graduate in Automation Engineering, you can work in both private and public companies, e.g. utility companies and industrial companies that manufacture and/or operate, e.g. wind turbines, pumps, robotic welding machines or flexible manufacturing systems (FMS).

The programme includes subjects such as database types, the role of contracts in the system development process, methods and tools for integration between systems, project management, distributed design and development, configuration and release management as well as test models and test planning.

Software developers typically get jobs as system developers, software architects and project managers of large-scale IT projects in Denmark and abroad.

In Denmark, higher education is focused on bringing about solutions for the real world. Traditional lectures are combined with industrial collaborations and teaching methods that promote students' ability to use what they have learned and to turn new knowledge into innovative solutions.

This way of studying requires a high degree of personal initiative and independent thinking. Thus, for some, studying in Denmark can be challenging and different from what they are used to. We feel confident that it will inspire you and help you succeed in whatever you decide to do in life.

COMING TO DENMARK

In the process of making the decision to study in Denmark, you will naturally have a lot of questions about all the practicalities. Here are some of the answers. Do not hesitate to contact us for further details.

DO I NEED A STUDENT VISA/RESIDENCE PERMIT?

If you are a citizen of a country outside the Nordic countries or the EU/EEA, you must hold a residence permit in order to reside and study in Denmark.

If you wish to apply for a residence permit as a student, both you and the educational institution in Denmark must supply information for the processing of your application. After you get admitted to a programme and pay the tuition fees for the first semester, UCN will begin its part of the student visa procedures.

You must obtain the permit before you arrive in Denmark, so please note that the processing time at the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration is two months.

EU/EEA/Swiss citizens can live, work and study in Denmark under the EU regulations on freedom of movement and do not need a visitor's visa, residence or work permit. However, they should obtain an EU residence document (registration certificate) from the State Administration after arrival.

WILL I NEED TO FIND MY OWN HOUSING?

Denmark does not have a tradition for on-campus housing as they do in other parts of the world. UCN will do its best to help international students get ready for their stay in Aalborg. However, all incoming students are required to find their own accommodation.

Aalborg is a very popular destination for studying, and so it is important that you begin your search for accommodation as soon as you have decided to study in Denmark. The earlier you start your search, the higher the chances that you will find the right place for you.

Luckily, it is relatively easy to find housing in Aalborg. Prices are quite low compared to other big cities, e.g. Copenhagen. An average monthly rent varies between around EUR 270 and 470, depending on the area, the size of the room/flat, the facilities available and the general standard of the accommodation.

Apart from certain dormitories, most flats for rent in Denmark are offered unfurnished,

TEMPORARY HOUSING GUARANTEE

The Municipality of Aalborg offers students a temporary housing guarantee of three months, giving you time to find a place to live. To be covered by the housing guarantee, you must have registered with AKU-Aalborg, which assigns dormitories and youth housing: www.aku-aalborg.dk

TIPS ON FINDING ACCOMMODATION

UCN co-operates with the dormitory UC House close to the city centre, which offers spacious, furnished rooms in a social environment with table tennis and a pool table in the common room.

It is common for students who have either not been offered or are not interested in a dormitory or youth housing to share a flat. After some time in Aalborg, a lot of our international students also decide to do this.

WHAT DOES IT COST TO LIVE AND STUDY IN AALBORG, AND CAN I AFFORD IT?

Denmark is an expensive country, but the standard of living is among the highest in the world. However, if you are sensible and follow local customs and economise – such as cycling to UCN and eating at home – life in Denmark should not blow your budget.

Your living expenses will naturally depend on your lifestyle and habits, but to give you an idea of what your average monthly expenses will be, here is a rough budget:

On the website www.studyindenmark.dk you will find much more information on living expenses and finances in Denmark. The website also offers important information on how to open a bank account as well as a series of practical tips, among other things to ensure you have enough cash to pay for expenses the first month until you have an account.

CAN I GET A JOB WHILE STUDYING?

At UCN, we offer assistance in your job search in the form of job seminars and CV workshops where we provide new students with helpful advice, tips and tricks. To start, it may be easier to get jobs such as babysitting, cleaning, housekeeping, waitering and delivering papers.

Many students in Denmark have part-time jobs alongside their studies and/or full-time jobs during the summer holidays. This can be a good way to cover your living expenses, build your network or practice certain skills. However, it is very important to remember that you are at UCN to study, and that your permit to reside in Denmark relies on you being a dedicated student who actively follows your study programme, does your homework and passes the exams.

A student job salary varies between 10 and 14 Euro per hour.

EU/EEA and Swiss citizens can work in Denmark under the EU rules regarding the free movement of people and services with no restriction on the number of working hours.

Non-EU/EEA/Swiss citizens may work in Denmark for up to 20 hours a week and full-time during June, July and August.

REQUIREMENTS AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The minimum entry requirements and selection criteria for studying at UCN also vary from programme to programme.

TUITION FEES

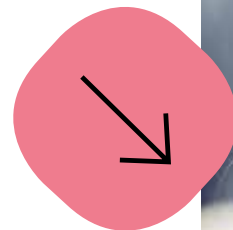
Tuition fees for non-EU/non-EEA citizens vary from 3,500 to 7,500 EUR per semester depending on the programme.

You will find an updated and programme-specific list of tuition fees on our website.

An application fee of EUR 100 also applies to non-EU/EEA students who need a residence permit (study visa) in order to study at UCN. If you are accepted for studies at UCN, we will deduct the application fee from the tuition fee for the first semester. If you are not accepted, the application fee will not be reimbursed.

As part of the Danish welfare and taxation system, education is free of charge, and by EU law, students from EU/EEA may study in Denmark under the same terms and conditions, waiving tuition fees.
